Featured Speaker: Mark Wieclaw "A Tax and a Promise"

Mark Wieclaw started collecting coins in 1975 and ancient coins in 1981. Mark is an educational speaker, an award-winning exhibitor, and is a past president of the Illinois Numismatic Association, The Chicago Coin Club, and the Ancient Coin Club of Chicago. Following is a brief synopsis of his presentation this evening.

"Beard Tax" tokens of Russian's Peter the Great issued between 1698-1725. Irish Gun Money (1698-1690) was created by melting brass items such as candle stick holders and cannons to form a coin that would later be exchanged for good silver. A promise was made by England's James II to repay his followers after he regained the throne. The brass coins not only had a date, but also the month so that there would be an orderly repayment schedule. Of course he never did return to the throne.

Unknown to most numismatists, these two unusual areas of coinage have undergone much research recently. This presentation will explain the history and reason behind these items.
